## 16 Challenges in 2016

Teaching assistant Mrs Kimberley Vallis is aiming to complete 16 challenges in 2016 to raise money for four charities that are close to her heart. Mrs Vallis wants to collect at least £1,000 for the organisations by achieving her target by this summer. They include horse riding, surfing, skateboarding, motorcycling and hiking in Snowdonia or the Brecon Beacons. The money collected will be shared between Southmead Hospital's early pregnancy assessment unit, the Miscarriage Association and Survive (against domestic violence). A portion will also go to TVT Messed up Mesh, which helps men and women experiencing severe health problems and complications from medical devices using surgical polypropylene synthetic mesh for hernias, prolapse, stress urinary incontinence and other bladder and bowel disorders. Mrs Vallis recently had a mesh that had been fitted removed after suffering constant pain. She said, "My 16th and final challenge will be decided by those who make a donation.
