

Key Stage 3 Curriculum – Year 7 English

Terms 1 - 6

Pupils will follow a course designed to improve their skills of speaking and listening, reading and writing. They read a range of fiction and non-fiction texts, and discuss and write about what they have read in a variety of ways. They undertake five to six units of work which cover the requirements of the National Curriculum. The order of the units is sequenced in the following ways:

- 1 Paragraphs
- 2 Understanding Written Texts
- 3 Child Language Development
- 4 Introduction to Shakespeare
- 5 Non-Fiction Writing
- 6 Non-Fiction Reading

Pupils are given regular opportunities for independent reading using the Accelerated Reader programme. Particular aspects of grammar, punctuation, spelling and paragraphing are 1, 3 and 5. Pupils draft pieces of extended writing and the importance of accuracy and punctuation is emphasized. Textual analysis, including language and structure, is taught during units 2, 4 and 6. There is significant emphasis on reflection and improvement time throughout the course.
